#### **BOT Approval**

Board Resolution No. 98, s. 2023 marks a significant milestone in Camarines Norte State College's commitment to global engagement. This resolution formally approves the "CNSC Internationalization Perspective, Prospects, and Targets 2024-2028," a comprehensive roadmap outlining the institution's vision and strategies for fostering a globally connected and competitive academic community. Recognizing the transformative power of internationalization in higher education, the Board of Trustees throws its full support behind this roadmap, paving the way for CNSC to enhance its academic reputation, broaden its research horizons, and cultivate a vibrant intercultural campus environment.

The approved roadmap outlines CNSC's ambitious goals for internationalization over the next five years. These goals include expanding academic mobility programs for students and faculty, promoting international research collaborations, integrating global perspectives into the curriculum, and strengthening partnerships with institutions worldwide. 
#### **Dedicated International Relations Office**

3. **Global Reputation Building.** The IRO collaborates with foreign universities, businesses, and organizations to enhance CNSC's academic reputation abroad.






The International Relations Office of the Camarines Norte State College (IRO)

The roadmap outlines a phased implementation plan with clear timelines, responsibilities, and resource allocation. Regular monitoring and evaluation mechanisms will track progress, measure impact, and ensure alignment with the roadmap's goals.

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#### Vision: A Globally Recognized Institution

CNSC aspires to be a leading institution renowned for its commitment to internationalization, academic excellence, and impactful global partnerships.

#### **Guiding Principles**

- Supporting International Student Integration. CNSC will provide comprehensive support services to international students, ensuring their smooth integration into the campus community.

#### 4. Strategic Partnerships and Networking

- Strengthening Existing Partnerships. CNSC will nurture existing partnerships while actively seeking new collaborations with universities, organizations, and businesses worldwide.
- Engaging with International Alumni. CNSC will establish a robust alumni network, connecting with graduates working and residing abroad.
- Leveraging Technology for Global Engagement. CNSC will utilize technology to enhance international communication, collaboration, and outreach.

### A Seven-Step Guide for CNSC Staff in International Exchange & Paper Presentations

Camarines Norte State College encourages both teaching and non-teaching staff to engage in international exchanges and paper presentations. To streamline this process, CNSC has implemented a clear seven-step application checklist.

Step 1: Initial Documentation

- Letter of Intent. Express your interest in the specific international opportunity.
- Invitation/Acceptance. Provide a copy of the official invitation or acceptance notification from the host institution or conference organizer.
- **Conference Dossier.** If applicable, include a printout of the conference program or relevant details.
- **Travel Itinerary.** Submit a proposed travel itinerary outlining your intended dates and destinations.
- **Previous Travels.** List any previous international travels undertaken within a specific timeframe.
- Expense Breakdown. Prepare a detailed proposal outlining anticipated expenses for the trip.
- Leave Form. Submit a completed leave form for the duration of your travel.
- Certification Letter. Include a signed letter certifying that you will not represent CNSC or use its name during any personal activities during the trip.

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#### Step 2: Endorsement from Dean/Campus Director

- Endorsement Letter. Obtain a signed endorsement letter from your respective Dean, Campus Director, or immediate supervisor, supporting your application.
- Evaluation Form. Complete the "Evaluation Form for the Necessity of Foreign Travel", justifying the relevance and benefits of your participation.
- **Budget Certification.** Obtain certification from the Budget Office confirming the availability of funds for your proposed travel.
- **Personal Funds Statement.** If applicable, provide a personal statement confirming the availability of personal funds to supplement any institutional support.

#### Step 3: Endorsement from Vice President

• Endorsement Letter. Secure an endorsement letter from the relevant Vice President (VPAA/VPRE/VPAF) based on the nature of your travel (academic, research, etc.).

#### Step 4: IRO Endorsement and CHED Clearance

- Endorsement Letter. The International Relations Office will review your application and provide an endorsement letter to the Commission on Higher Education International Affairs Staff.
- CHED-IAS Clearance. Obtain clearance from CHED-IAS, a crucial step for governmentfunded travel.

#### Step 5: Office of the President Endorsement

• Endorsement Letter. Upon receiving CHED-IAS clearance, the IRO will forward your application to the Office of the President for endorsement.

#### Step 6: Board Resolution/Referendum

• **Board Resolution/Referendum.** The Board of Trustees will issue a resolution or conduct a referendum to formally approve your foreign travel request.

#### Step 7: Travel Authority Issuance

• **Travel Authority.** Once all endorsements and approvals are secured, the Office of the President will issue the official travel authority, granting permission for your international exchange or paper presentation.

#### Memorandum of Understanding Between Dongseo University and Camarines Norte State College

**Dongseo University, Korea**, and Camarines Norte State College, Philippines, joined forces to advance international academic exchange and collaboration on **November 23, 2019**. As outlined in the Memorandum of Understanding, both institutions are committed to promoting mutual understanding and goodwill through a range of initiatives. These include faculty and student exchanges, joint research endeavors, sharing of academic resources and publications, and co-organizing international research conferences.

This agreement, built on a foundation of mutual trust and respect, marks the commitment of both institutions to broaden academic horizons and foster global citizenship. While the specifics of each exchange program will be determined through further negotiation, the MOU provides a solid framework for a fruitful and enduring partnership between Dongseo University and Camarines Norte State College.

#### MOA Signing at COSMIC 2024: A New Era of Bicol Region Internationalization


